STAFF REPORTS

Lindsay Kozlowski- Ms. Kozlowski and Mr. Basinger received the second phase of the Goodwin Tombaugh Project, which is a large distribution line for People's Gas.

Ben Schweiger- Mr. Schweiger is working on a GRACE ad for WANB radio station. Ben along with Ms. Hlatky are attending field visits for GRACE applicants. Mr. Cowell set up a meeting with Pierce Wilson to go over the drill along with Ben. This will help with settings and understanding the drill more for any issues that may arise.

April Morris- Ms. Morris nothing additional to include.

Lisa Snider- Ms. Snider did a reassessment of Dirt and Gravel Roads in March and lost approximately 85 miles of Dirt and Gravel Roads to claim for funding. This reevaluation will help with funding opportunities for the upcoming 21/22 year. The West Nile Virus intern position has been advertised.

Ms. Snider noted this is the budget for Mr. Jared Zinn's Watershed Specialist position and the request shows how funding will be used for the position from July 1, 2021-June 30, 2022.

A motion was made by Melissa Adamson to submit the Watershed Specialist Funding Request. Bill Wentzel seconded. (Motion Passed)

2021-2022 PACD NPS Mini-Grants

Ms. Snider stated the two mini-grants are projects that Mr. Zinn worked on to obtain funding through PACD.

A motion was made by Commissioner Belding to approve 2021-2022 PACD NPS Mini Grants submission. Greg Hopkins seconded. (Motion Passed)

Cumberland Township Contract Extension Nesmith Road-Dec 31, 2021

Ms. Snider added the Township submitted the bid package this week and will advertised twice before the end of April 2021. The first part of May the Township should award the contract at the Township meeting. Ms. Snider is requesting an extension on the contract that is currently set to expire June 30, 2021.

A motion was made by Bill Wentzel to approve extension of Nesmith Road Contract to December 31, 2021. Dave Shipman seconded. (Motion Passed)

REPORTS FROM COOPERATING AGENCIES

Phil Evans-Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) gave a recap of items completed or are still waiting for items to be finished: Wasilesky's one year is finishing up and will be off the books. Gene Saurborn has yet to do the nutrient management plan. Ethan Virgilli will be up and running with city water. Glen Kerr worked on a water system design. John Robinson was behind due to contractor issues. Willis's cover crops are still growing. Recently announced next round awardees Phil Judy will get a Comprehensive Nutrient Management Plan (CNMP) and Cree's Farm CNMP is close to being finished. Conservation Security Program (CSP) deadline is May 7, 2021. Phil is working with Sara to visit Hilverdings and Henrys farms. The office restrictions have lifted some, where one person is in the office on a rotating schedule and outdoor visits are permitted. Mr. Evans had the annual nondiscrimination clause agreement for NRCS to be signed by directors.

Commissioner Belding along with Mr. Scull sat on a Southwest Regional Agricultural Public Council with Republic Foods a few years ago and is being revitalized. Regional with nine counties involved. Working towards meat processing USDA in Greene County.

Funding from the Federal Government regarding Forgivable Small Business Loan and a grant for Hospitality Funding. The intent is to help make these businesses whole from lost profits during Covid. Less any other funding sources that may have been issued. 7.2 million American Rescue Act funding is coming to Greene County with restrictions. Commissioner Belding noted based on qualifications some of that funding could go towards the Farmland Preservation since it is a government funded program. The other hope is for water, sewage and broadband expansions. The county is looking for a half page initiative stating the need and cost for the program to receive funds.

There was no need for an executive session.
