There is a .25 per item entry fee in these departments. Must accompany entry blank!

All exhibits should be pre-registered by June 30, exhibitors are encouraged to list every entry that they may have available to bring.

Entries for exhibitors 19 and under should be entered in Department XI. Entries received in any other home and garden departments will compete with adult entries.

***Some classes have been divided into "Traditional" and "Vocational" categories. Only persons 20 years of age and older who are enrolled in a vocational / special needs program may enter the "Vocational" category.

Actual items to be exhibited will be accepted ONLY between 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM on Sunday, August 7, 2011.

Fair management reserves the right to refuse to accept any entry deemed by fair management to be in poor taste.

Fair management has the right to open any and all canned good items!

Only one entry per category per exhibitor will be accepted. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to decide in which category an item will be entered.

Judging for the Home & Garden classes will take place on Monday, August 8. No exhibitors or spectators will be permitted in the hall during the judging.

Any entry not deemed worthy will not be placed. Judges' decisions are final.

"Best of Show" rosettes will be awarded at the discretion of the Judges.

Exhibits will be guarded; every effort will be made to protect them from damage. However, neither the Fair Board nor the management is responsible for accidents, loss or damage.

Fair management may at any time order the removal of any exhibit or part of any exhibit that has become unfit for show.

Exhibits will be removed from the hall only on Sunday, August 14, 2011 between the hours of 1:00 PM and 3:00 PM. No exceptions will be made. Perishable items will be destroyed if not picked up at this time; others will be kept for one week. If you have any questions contact Jeanette.

**2011 HERSHEY'S COCOA CLASSIC

RULES:

1. Exhibitor must be an individual (age 8 through and including 18 years ONLY) who is a Pennsylvania resident; one entry per person.
2. **NEW! Entrants may NOT have won 1st place in this Hershey's Cocoa Cookie, Brownie, Bar contest at any other fair in 2011.**
3. Entry must be a plate of six (6) cookies, brownies or bars made from "scratch" (no mixes).
4. **COOKIE, BROWNIE OR BAR:** A minimum of 1/2 cup of **HERSHEY'S BAKING CHIPS** (any variety) must be used and listed as "HERSHEY'S" plus the name of the specific chip variety in the cookie-brownie-bar batter part of the recipe.
5. **FROSTING/DRIZZLE:** If chocolate frosting and/or chocolate drizzle is used, **HERSHEY'S COCOA** must be used and listed as "HERSHEY'S COCOA" in the frosting/drizzle part of the recipe.

7. Entry must be submitted for judging on a doily set on top of a cardboard or a disposable plate.
8. Recipe(s) must be submitted with the entry, printed on one side of 8-1/2" x 11" paper. Recipe must list all ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. Entrant's name, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages.
9. Refrigeration is not available at the Fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.
10. Judging Criteria:

Flavor	30 points
(aroma, taste, good balance of flavorings)	
Texture	25 points
(appropriate for the type of cookie, brownie or bar)	
Inside Characteristics	20 points
(even grain, evenly baked; free from air pockets)	
Outside Characteristics	15 points
(uniform size, shape, appearance; overall appeal)	
Creativity	10 points
TOTAL 100 points
