#### Rules

3. An exhibit shall consist of a bale section of long hay approximately eight inches thick.
4. Sample of hay shown must be grown by exhibitor in Greene, Fayette, and Washington Counties.

5. If, in the opinion of the judge or department head, a sample of hay is entered in the wrong class, it is their right to transfer it to another class.
6. Unless exhibitor requests otherwise, hay samples will be destroyed at end of show.
7. Entries close at 3 p.m., Sunday, August 7.
8. Judging: Monday, August 8.
