TIOGA.

Wellsboro, Pa., Nov. 8.—Election in Tioga county passed off very quietly with a light vote, the only excitement being a twelfth-hour rally of the Prohibition force to elect Sylvester Doan, Prohibition candidate for commissioner, over Freeman H. Smith, the regular Democratic nominee. Doan received a good-sized vote.

LYCOMING.

Williamsport, Pa., Nov. 8.—Returns from 18 districts out of 84 indicate the election of Harvey W. Whitehead (Dem.) for judge by 2,500 over William H. Spencer (Rep.)

GREENE.

Waynesburg, Pa., Nov. 8.—The Democratic ticket won in Greene county by the usual majority. A light vote was polled for all the county offices, and the only interest was in the election of county commissioner on the Republican ticket. The returns indicate the election
