MINUTES

Walter Stout, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

In attendance were Supervisors Walter Stout and Troy Smith, Secretary Diane Headlee and resident Leonard Dulaney. Supervisor Charles Hickman was absent.

I. There were no comments from the public.

II. Correspondence and Reports

- 1. Received Correspondence:
 - There was no report of any received correspondence.
- 2. Planning Board:
 - The Board did not meet in June due to the lack of any items needing attention or action.
- 3. Zoning Board:
 - No meetings of the Zoning Hearing Board are scheduled.
- 4. Park Board:
 - The water has been turned on at the park and the new rest room facility is fully
 operational. The designated handicapped parking spaces have been painted. We
 are still waiting for the community service crews to become available to paint the
 exterior of the building. Once that has been completed, the total project will be
 ready for inspection by the PA Department of Conservation and Natural Resources
 (DCNR).
- 5. Roadmaster's Report:
 - The road crew worked on cutting and cleaning ditches along township roads, removing trees and tree limbs, installed curb stops at the park at the handicapped parking spaces. Cleaned and prepared the shop for the election on June 2nd, and preformed maintenance on various equipment. Tar and chipping is scheduled for August 10 and 11, 2020.
- 6. Solicitor's Remarks: Mr. Makel was not present.
- 7. We have been advised by EQT that a sound absorbing wall has been installed at the Habe Well Pad pursuant to complaints of noise.

Pursuant to action taken by the Board of Supervisors on January 14, 2020 wherein a motion was adopted to loan the Machinery Fund \$3,750 from the General Fund to pay for the 2011 Ford F-250 pick-up truck, the Chairman asked the Board to consider a motion approving the repayment of said loan to the General Fund from the Machinery Fund in full on June 10, 2020. The motion was made by Troy Smith and seconded by Walter Stout. Motion carried.

3. Operations, Buildings, Grounds & Highways

a. <u>Use of Park Ball Fields – Revolution Fast-Pitch Softball Association</u>

We have been approached by the Revolution Fast-Pitch Softball Association for permission to use the fields at the park for softball games since the Waynesburg Girls Softball Association is no longer using them. The WGSA has agreed to relinquish their participation in the Use Rental Agreement currently in effect.

The Chairman asked the Board to consider a motion to void the current Use Rental Agreement between the township and the Waynesburg Girls Softball Association and enter into a 2-year agreement (2020-21) with the Revolution Fast-Pitch Softball Association for the use of the park ball fields on Monday through Thursday evenings from June 10 through October 31, 2020 and April 1, 2021 through October 31, 2021. Any scheduled township activities (rental of park) with advance notice shall have priority. Pursuant to the agreement, the RFPSA has agreed to provide in-kind service for park clean-up and ball field maintenance. The motion was made by Troy Smith and seconded by Walter Stout. Motion carried.
