4. Opening/Awarding of Bid – Utility Tractor

Sealed bids were requested pursuant to Section 3102 of the Township Code for the purchase of a new Utility Tractor with mower, pallet forks and front-loader. Bids were due and opened on March 11, 2019 at 11:00 a.m. and the results are as follows:

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Recommended Action

Following a thorough review of each bid and all of the submitted specifications supplied with each tractor, consider a motion to accept the bid of \$18,473.00 received from Morris Machinery for the 'as specified' Branson 2510h tractor, BL100S front loader, 42-inch pallet forks and the 60-inch belly mower.

d. Approval of Purchase of New Utility Trailer

Recommended Action

Pursuant to the requirements of Section 3101 of the Second Class Township Code, consider a motion to approve the purchase a new Lo-Pro split tilt-trailer from Smouse Trucks and Vans Inc., for \$5,390.00, to be paid from the Machinery Fund.

3. Operations, Buildings, Grounds & Highways

a. <u>Use of Park Ball Fields – Waynesburg Girls Softball Assn.</u>

Recommended Action

Consider a motion to enter into a 3-year agreement (2019-21) with the Waynesburg Girls Softball Association for the use of the park ball fields on Monday through Thursday evenings from April 1 through July 31 of each year. Any scheduled township activities (rental of park) shall have priority with advance notice. The WGSA has agreed to provide in-kind service for park clean-up and ball field maintenance.

b. Water Line Extension – Garner Run Road area

Recommended Action

Pursuant to the Comprehensive Plan Goals and Objectives to increase access to public water service within the township, consider a motion to develop and proceed with a joint construction project with the Southwestern PA Water Authority, pending their approval, to continue an 8-inch water line from the current terminus at the park to a point near the intersection of Garner Run Road and Waterdam Road for an approximate distance of 6,000 feet to serve eight households. The line installation would cross private property through a series of right-of-ways, rather than in the PennDOT right-of-way along Garner Run Road. The estimated cost to the township for the project materials and engineering is \$154,000. The township would also provide labor, materials and equipment for backfilling, stone and roadway restoration. Funding for the project will come from the Impact Fee monies.

Recommended Action

Consider a motion to approve the renewal of Heavy Hauling Agreements, dated March 1, 2019, with Equitrans Midstream Corp., for Craig's Run Road (T-558), and for Castile Ridge Road (T-564) for a fee of \$300.00 for each road, pursuant to the approved Schedule of Fees.

2. Heavy Hauling Agreement – EQT Production Co.

Recommended Action

Consider a motion to approve a Heavy Hauling Agreement, with an effective date of March 1, 2019 to March 1, 2020, with EQT Production Co. for Byard Road (T-514), for a fee of \$300.00 pursuant to the Schedule of Fees.
