d. <u>Excavator Rental for Porter Street/Green Valley Water Line Construction</u>

In accordance with the agreement with SPWA to construct the water line on Porter Street and Green Valley Roads, the township is required to backfill the excavated ditch. Quotes were solicited for a large excavator, as the one owned by the township is too small to adequately perform the necessary work. Two quotes were received for monthly rental as follows:

United Rentals\$5,069.47/monthBlack Diamond Equipment Rental\$4,973.50/month
