MINUTES

Walter Stout, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

In attendance were Supervisors Walter Stout, Charles Hickman; and Secretary Diane Headlee. Troy Smith was absent from the meeting. Also in attendance were residents Jim Hughes and Deb Harris.

I. Requests to Address the Board/Public Comment

Deb Harris asked if there was a speed limit on Byard Road, because cars were travelling fast past her driveway. Mr. Stout indicated that the speed limit on all township roads is set by state statute at 35 mph. The state police would be responsible for enforcing the speed limit.

II. Correspondence and Reports

1. Received Correspondence:

- Received a letter from PA Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) of an Informal Public Conference to be held at the Morris Township Municipal Building, 77 Park Drive in Prosperity from 1:00 pm until 3:00 pm, to discuss the recent application filed by Consol PA Coal Company for the Enlow Fork Mine to revise 3,687 acres of existing permitted area from Developmental mining to Longwall Mining. Interested persons are encouraged to attend the meeting and give testimony regarding the application. The line appears to fall between the Gary Winn property and the James Cole property on Rt. 221 north.
- A pre-construction meeting of all the successful bidders for the Park Rehabilitation & Renovation Project was held on Tuesday, June 4 to discuss the construction timeline and schedule. The parties all agreed to start work during the week of Labor Day, (Tuesday, September 3), so as to not interfere with the park rentals during the summer months. The project is expected to be completed in 3 to 4 weeks after commencing.
- We were advised by the Department of Conservation & Natural Resources that our request for an amendment to the Washington Township Park Rehabilitation grant application was approved for an additional \$35,706. We have also received commitments from two anonymous sources for \$25,000 to be used toward the required township match. This will be a total of approximately \$84,000 from the DCNR for rehabilitation at the park.
- On June 13, 2019, Civil Engineering Consultants (CEC) will be meeting with the DEP to review the Longmile Road slip and determine which permit will be necessary for the repair project.

3. Zoning Board:

 The required Zoning hearing to consider the application from Consol Coal for a Special Exception for a Bleeder Air Shaft on Jim Cole's property on Rt. 221 was held at 7:00 pm, Thursday, May 23, 2019. The applicant was granted a Special Exception pursuant to the Zoning Ordinance. There was no one present in the audience for the meeting. The driveway for the Big Sky Well Pad will be shared and Consol will exit off to the right prior to reaching the well site.
