c. Opening of Bids - Stone

The Chairman asked the Board to consider a motion to refer the bids as shown on the bid tabulation (see Minute Book file) to the Supervisors and the Solicitor for further review, with further action anticipated at the March 8th, 2022 meeting. The motion was made by Charles Hickman and seconded by Troy Smith. Motion carried.

- 3. <u>Township Supervisors</u>
 - a. Ordinances, Resolutions
 - 1. <u>Enactment of Ordinance #1 of 2022 Regulating the Opening and</u> <u>Cutting of Township Roads</u>

The Chairman asked the Board to consider a motion to approve the following Ordinance (#1 - 2022):

An Ordinance of Washington Township, Greene County, Pennsylvania, Regulating the Opening and Cutting of Township Roads as well as Providing Penalties tor the Violation of Such Ordinance. (See Ordinance Book for complete Ordinance).

The motion was made by Charles Hickman and seconded by Walter Stout. Motion carried.

2. Adoption of Resolution #1-2022 - PIONEER Grant Application

The Greene County Commissioners, through the Department of Planning and Community Development, have developed a leveraging program using Act 13 funding for improvements to infrastructure. The total grant request is not to exceed \$50,000 and requires at 50% match. The following resolution must be adopted to participate in the program. Mr. Stout explained that the adoption of the Resolution was not a formal commitment to the Waterdam Road water line project, but that particular project is the closest to being "shovel-ready." A commitment to the actual project, if any, would come at a later date.

The Chairman then asked the Board to consider motion to adopt Resolution #1 of 2022 which authorizes the signed submittal of an Application to the Potential Infrastructure Opportunities Needing Extra (PIONEER) requesting a grant, not to exceed \$50,000 and pledging a match of the same amount, for a project to construct an 8-inch waterline on Waterdam Road from the intersection of Garner Run Road. The motion was made by Charles Hickman and seconded by Walter Stout. Motion carried.

b. <u>Approval of Creation of a Sub-Division – Patterson Farms, LLC</u>

Pursuant to the favorable recommendation of the Washington Township Planning Board at a meeting to be held on February 3, 2022, having met the conditions and requirements of the Township Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance, and having received approval from the Township Engineer, the Zoning Officer and the Sewage Enforcement Officer, the Chairman asked the Board to consider a motion to approve the development by Cathy Patterson a/k/a Patterson Farms, LLC, of a 3-lot Sub-Division totaling 104.787 acres, being the parcel of land identified as Tax ID #24-01-0102-B. The motion was made by Charles Hickman and seconded by Walter Stout. Motion carried.

IV. <u>New Business:</u>

A brief discussion was held regarding the need to replace the roofs on both pavilions at the park with metal roofing to match that on the rest room building. Mr. Stout explained that funding for the project had been budgeted in this year's Act 13 spending plan. It was decided to prepare project specifications and advertise for bids for the project.
