

ELECTION BOARD MEETING - VOTED

May 24, 2022

The Greene County Election Board meeting was brought out of recess at 3:56 pm by Chairman Mike Belding in the first-floor meeting room of the County Office Building. Others in attendance were: Commissioner Betsy McClure, Commissioner Blair Zimmerman, Solicitor Robert Grimm, Judy Snyder, and Heather Hurst from Buchanan Ingersoll and Rooney.

Old Business:

1. Declaration was not dated 18

The State requested a separate report in which ballots without the required date on the Declaration were to counted and results reported to them on a separate reporting form. Approved by Betsy McClure and seconded by Blair Zimmerman. Vote unanimous. Based on directive from the Election Board, the Election Department is to count but NOT include the results in our Unofficial First Signing of the May 17, 2022 Primary. Vote unanimous.

NOTE: It was discovered during the count that one (1) of the above referenced ballots was not sealed in a secrecy envelope therefore Betsy McClure made a motion to reject that ballot and it was seconded by Blair Zimmerman. Vote Unanimous.

2. One additional ballot was received today in the Election office after the deadline; therefore, Betsy McClure made a motion to reject that ballot and it was seconded by Blair Zimmerman. Vote Unanimous.
3. Consider approving the signing of the Unofficial Returns with the understanding that it **will not** include the identification of the write-ins. Approved by Betsy McClure and seconded by Blair Zimmerman. Vote unanimous.

PUBLIC COMMENT – Heather A. Hurst stated that she was not a witness to the opening and counting of the 18 ballots referenced above; however Judy Snyder reminded her that she was in fact in the room at the time of opening and counting as well as reviewing each tally report provide to the Canvass board for signature.

ADJOURNMENT – Approve to recess the Election Board Meeting until the second Signing of the Official Computation on June 6th at 9:00 am. Approved by Betsy McClure and seconded by Blair Zimmerman. Vote unanimous.
